

National Marine Planning Framework

- Long term planning framework for how we use, protect, enjoy seas – out to 2040
- Parallel to National Planning Framework
- Sector by sector elaboration of guiding objectives and planning policies (aquaculture through to waste water)
- Critical basis for future decision making by marine decision makers - who are obliged to implement NMPF






Structure – NMPF Chapters



- Overarching Marine Planning Policies Apply to all proposals
 - Grouped according to the three Sustainable Development Pillars –
 Environmental, Economic and Social
- Sectoral Marine Planning Policies
 - Aquaculture, Defence & Security, Energy, Fisheries, Mineral Exploration, Ports/Harbours, Safety at Sea, Seaweed Harvesting, Sport & Recreation, Telecommunications, Tourism, Wastewater Treatment & Disposal
- 92 Policies to be referenced 32 Overarching, 60 Sectoral

This web map portal is Ireland's first marine spatial planning portal. It links planning within the Maritime area and the relevant policies for each marine sector or activity listed in the National Marine Planning Framework (NMPF). The web portal is an initiative of the Government of Ireland. The site has 3 main areas: Activities Map, Activities and Policies Map.

Our latest update has added a MSP Hub which has information on all Government Departments and Agencies with a role in the Maritime area, as well as the latest news and updates on Marine Planning in Ireland.

Activities Map: The map here will display marine activities. All activities are off by default and you can turn on each activity layer by clicking the eye icon. The legend for each layer is available once the layer is turned on. You can choose to turn on and off as many layers as you need but there will be slower response times when everything is turned on or very busy layers are resolving.

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Policies Map: Here the user can draw a shape on the map to select an area of interest and the relevant NMPF policies will be displayed. These can then be expanded to show the full policy wording or explored in more detail using the "more info" link.



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

Overarching Marine Planning Policies - Environmental



Environmental - Ocean Health

Ireland's marine waters (offshore, inshore and coastline) are home to a rich and diverse range of species and habitats. Our maritime area contains a wide variety of habitats ranging from shallow inshore reefs and sandbanks to canyons, seamounts, troughs and cold-water coral reefs in deeper waters.

The Environment - Ocean Health chapters of the NMPF help to realise the opportunities Ireland has to continually improve its marine and coastal environment. With regard to policy related to the management of marine environment matters, the NMPF is but one part and the Environment - Ocean Health chapters are shaped by Ireland's ongoing Marine Strategy Framework Directive (MSFD) work among other factors.

Policy 1



Environmental - Ocean Health Policy 1

Compliance with NMPF policies relating to:

- Biodiversity
- Non-Indigenous Species
- Water Quality
- Sea-floor and Water Column Integrity
- Marine litter
- Underwater Noise

Biodiversity Policy 1

Proposals incorporating features that enhance or facilitate species adaptation or migration, or natural native habitat connectivity will be supported, subject to the outcome of statutory environmental assessment processes and subsequent decision by the competent authority, and where they contribute to the policies and objectives of the NMPF. Proposals that may have significant adverse impacts on species adaptation or migration, or on natural native habitat connectivity must demonstrate that they will, in order of preference and in accordance with legal requirements:

Every NMPF Policy is listed

- a) avoid,
- b) minimise, or
- c) mitigate
- significant adverse impacts on species adaptation or migration, or on natural native habitat connectivity.





Proposals that demonstrate they will contribute to enhancing the significance of heritage assets will be supported, subject to the outcome of statutory environmental assessment processes and subsequent decision by the competent authority, and where they contribute to the policies and objectives of the NMPF. Proposals unable to contribute to enhancing the significance of heritage assets will only be supported if they demonstrate that they will, in order of preference:

- a) avoid,
- b) minimise, or
- c) mitigate

harm to the significance of heritage assets, and

d) if it is not possible, to mitigate harm, then the public benefits for proceeding with the proposal must outweigh the harm to the significance of the heritage assets. (see definition of 'Public Benefits' in the NMPF Glossary)


